2. Garden Planning

Guest Sarah Tuck and Rebecca Graves have started growing seedlings that should be ready for planting in late May or early June.

Guest Rob McLellan suggested contacting the Ottawa Wildflower Seed Library which Sarah Tuck advised Rebecca is connected to them.

Member Lorraine Rekmans asked about the status of including sweet grass. Guest Chris Wilson advised that the Ferguson Forest Centre had suggested containing sweet grass in pots but he will discuss with staff again.

Member Lorraine Rekmans suggested the path at the waterfront may need to be re-graded as it is steep. Guest Chris Wilson will discuss with Ferguson Forest Centre staff.

3. Grants and Crowdfunding

Guest Sarah Tuck reviewed the Zeffy campaign she set-up and feedback was provided. It was decided the goal will be set to \$10,000 with an end date of June 21, 2025. Member Lorraine Rekmans will share the campaign and everyone will share form there.

Guest Rob McLellan suggested the Nursery include an option to add a donation during their sales and soliciting businesses. Chris Wilson will discuss donations during sales with the Ferguson Forest Centre. member Lorraine Rekmans advised businesses had been solicited and little was gained, but it can be tried again.

Guest Sarah Tuck suggested reaching out to Nature Canada again as they had seemed interested in the project. Hillary will reach out.
